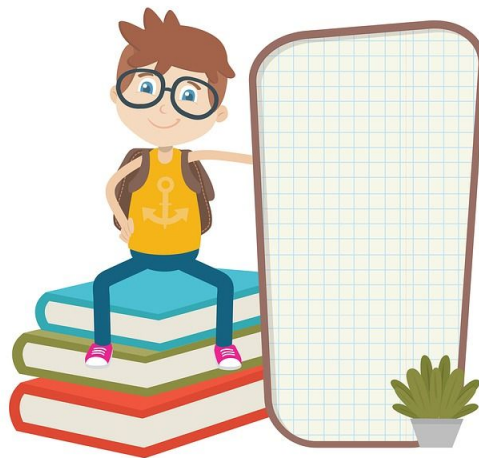
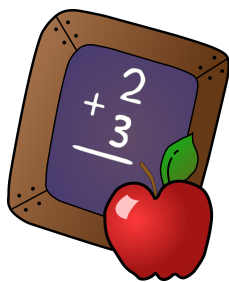


Managing Difficult Students

20 Strategies for Dealing with Difficult Students

Misbehavior Happens: How can you handle it...

1. Always stay calm, take a deep breathe
2. Have a positive tone
3. Make sure the student understands, you do not like the behavior, not the person
4. Give them a chance to respond
5. Do not blame or ridicule
6. Emphasize problem solving not punishment
7. Help student understand the responsibility of their behavior
8. Remain courteous and do not respond to anger
9. Treat all students respectfully
10. Be an attentive listener
11. Model the behavior you respect
12. Be clear with what is misbehavior
13. Be mindful of cultural differences
14. Teach social skills
15. Avoid labels
16. Teach about paying attention, following directions and asking for help
17. Rewarding acceptable behavior
18. Ignore small problems- do not disrupt classroom
19. Reprimand if necessary
20. Speak privately if necessary

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Setting the Tone
